

## **Milton Ulladulla Subtropical Rainforest Revival** A Saving our Species initiative with Milton Rural Landcare

Milton Ulladulla Subtropical Rainforest (MUSR) is a highly threatened vegetation community that is restricted to the volcanic soils of the Milton and Ulladulla area. It represents the southern limit of subtropical rainforest in eastern Australia and has been highly cleared. It was also severely impacted by the black summer fires. The ongoing key threats to the community include domestic stock damage, edge effects, fragmentation and weed invasion.



Conservation of MUSR is being undertaken as part of the NSW Saving our Species program through a community focused partnership between state and local government, private landholders and Milton Rural Landcare.

The project has increased the area of the rainforest and has reduced the edge:area ratio across the rainforest distribution, helping to reduce the impact of edge effects on remnants.



The project has increased the area of this threatened rainforest by **1.5%** and has **reduced the edge:area ratio** across the rainforest distribution, helping to reduce the impact of edge effects on remnants. The small increase over the last year has been the planting of two new isolated remnants.

7500 plants in 7ha with 80% survival



Over **500** volunteer hours



**24 ha** of rainforest fenced against stock

Area of the rainforest increased by **1.5%**

Bringing people together has helped build resilience, which has now been transferred into building resilience in the rainforest.
